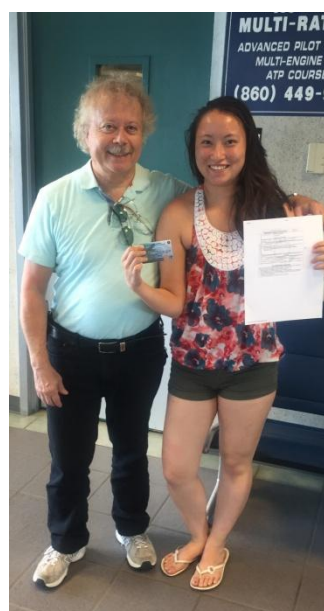
Huge congratulations to **Mirai and Akihiro Hashimoto**, who both became CFI-I this month. Way to go!!!

The FAA and industry have partnered together to develop the replacement for the Practical Test Standards. The Airman Certification Standards bring substantial improvements to the certification process. This webinar will provide some background on how the ACS was developed and then explain how the ACS is used during both knowledge tests (AKA written tests) and the practical tests. 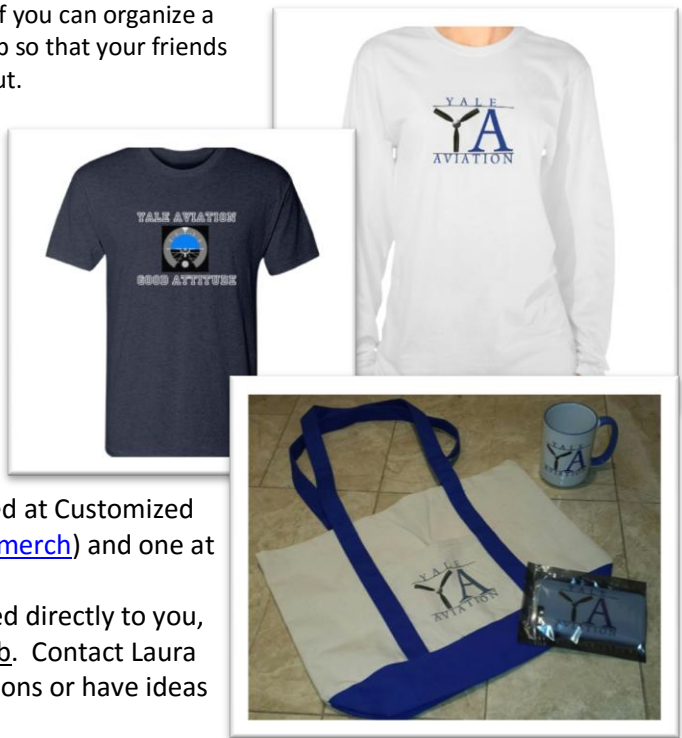
